Today, on Global MND/ALS Awareness Day, we are pleased to share our latest newsletter with you.

Today sees the announcement of £4.25M MND research funding from a consortium of MND charities and government organisations. Euan MacDonald Centre researchers are proud to be part of this extremely positive collaborative effort that will unite six Universities across the UK, and aims to make big progress towards the ambition of making MND treatable within years, not decades.

We are pleased to report that our clinical trial, MND-SMART, is going from strength to strength. Approximately 350 people with MND have joined the trial, and we are now open at 17 sites across the UK. We're so pleased to be able to give people the opportunity to join a clinical trial. We would like to thank everyone involved, particularly the people with MND who have helped us design and continually improve the trial to make it easier to participate.

Our other big news so far this year is that the Euan MacDonald Centre has recently hosted the 'European Network to Cure ALS' (ENCALS) scientific conference in Edinburgh. Over 600 MND researchers from across Europe (and some from further afield) joined us for a three-day marathon of science and networking. For many this was the first inperson conference since the Covid-19 pandemic and the atmosphere was buzzing with ideas, interactions and collaborations to propel MND research forward even faster.

As always we would like to say thank you to our generous donors and fundraisers, without whom much of our research would not be possible.



# £4.25M grant kick starts UK-wide collaborative MND research effort

We are delighted that Euan MacDonald Centre researchers at the University of Edinburgh are among those at six UK Universities to benefit from this new funding, which comes from a consortium of MND charities and government organisations.


